## BYC Annual Meeting Scheduled for November 17

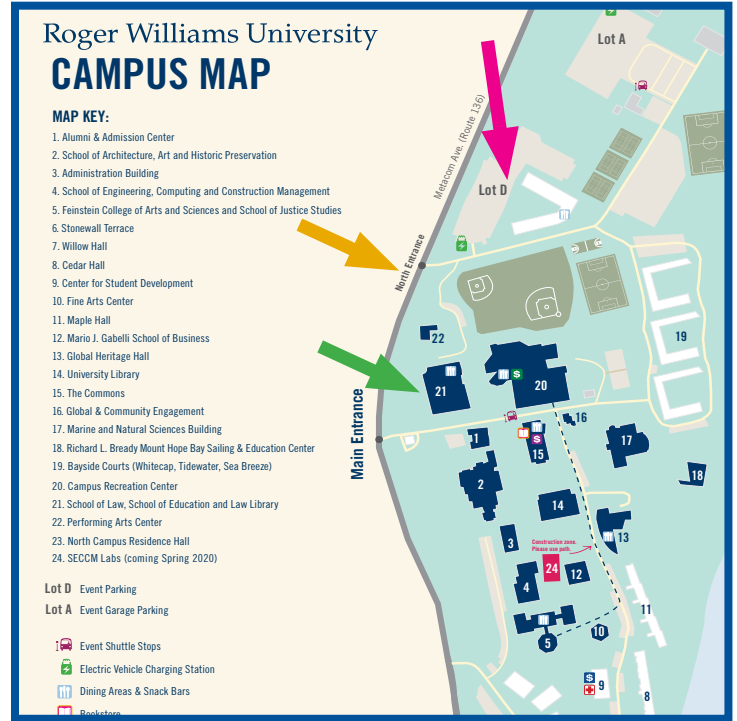
BYC members are invited and encouraged to join their Executive Committee and fellow members at our Annual Meeting. The meeting lets us reminisce about the fun

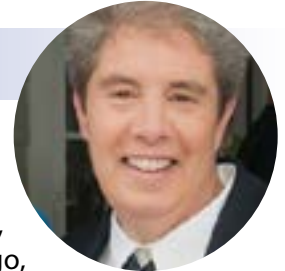
## COMMODORE'S QUARTERS

# WATERFRONT COMMITTEE

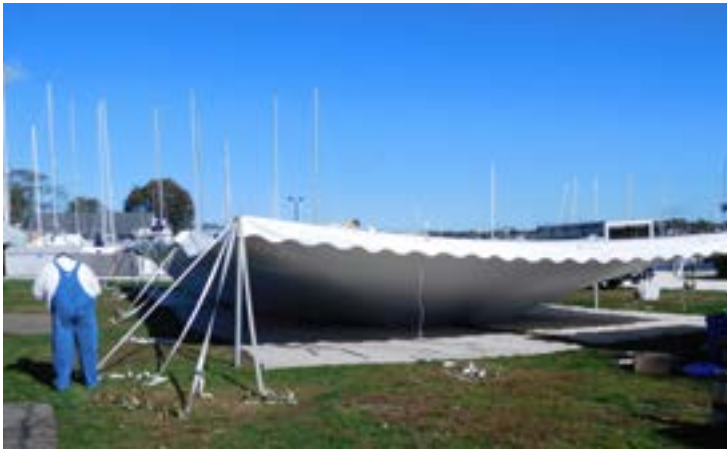

The Mercs and J/22s have been hauled after an awesome season on the Bay teaching and tacking all over our harbor.

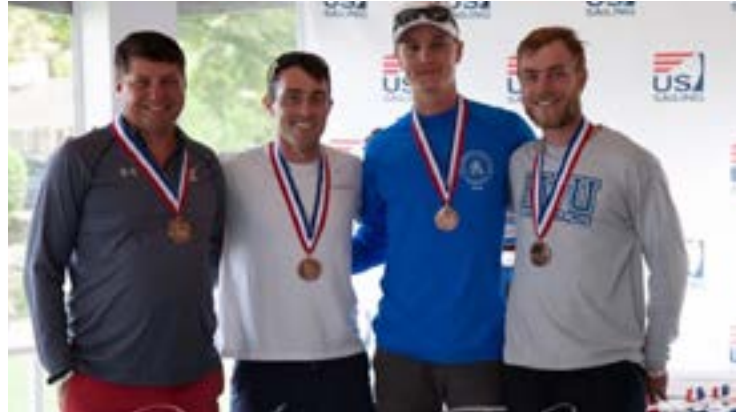

## It Was Bristol vs. Barrington in the NBYA Swanson/Bay Cup Team Races

Every yacht club on the bay was invited to attend the annual Narragansett Bay Yachting Association (NBYA) Team Race Championship hosted by last year's winner, Barrington Yacht Club. However, only the clubs out of Bristol and Barrington sent two three-boat teams to the event. Each club fielded a spinnaker (Swanson Cup) team and a non-spinnaker (Bay Cup) team. Bristol's teams consisted of:

**Swanson Cup:** *Alice* - Bill Barlow; *Phoenix* - Bruce Cox; *Hula* - Mike Allen

**Bay Cup:** *Moxie* - Carol and Andrew Scanlon; *Aeolus* - Chris Boutilier; *Phase III* - Carl Supancic

The event consists of two races for each team, scored by adding the finish places in both races of each boat on the team for a total team score, with the low score winning the event. While the Barrington team won the Bay Cup, the two Swanson teams ended in a tie and the race committee determined that Barrington prevailed by way of a tiebreaker.

However, the Bristol team reviewed the results and, based on the race documents and results, determined that Bristol should have prevailed in the tiebreaker. A request for redress was submitted, requesting that the NBYA event organizers revisit the tiebreaking instructions laid out by the event documents and the Racing Rules of Sailing 2016 – 2020. NBYA is pursuing the review with US Sailing judges and as of this writing they are still working to pull the required hearing together. To be continued...
