2025 Season Recap



The August 15th Annual Youth Awards Dinner marked the end of EBSF's 2025 Youth Instructional program. The 2025 program included 39 days of sailing camp, and 161 junior sailors taught by our 17 instructors. Participants raced in four 420 regattas, and six Opti regattas. The students marched with their epic float in the July 4 parade, and sailed to Hog Island on three occasions. Camp was attacked by pirates 4 times, a total of 16 watermelons were consumed along with enough freeze pops to get through two heat waves. At this year's dinner, when youngsters were asked if they had fun this year, the room exploded with cheers and shouts. It was great to see these kids from all backgrounds getting their paper plate awards recognizing their accomplishments and their foibles.

NBYA Junior Race Week: Friday's dinner capped a very busy week for EBSF and Barrington YC who shared duties hosting NBYA Junior Race Week at Bristol Town Beach. Dinner was hosted Tuesday night at BYC for racers and parents, funded by NBYA with food from the Common Pub. Kristin Brown and Emily Augello did a fabulous job leading EBSF's volunteers (thank you if you were one of them!), managing land activities while Barrington ran things on the water. We are grateful to both of them for leading this huge event and hope they got a chance for a nap the following weekend.

Adult Sailing: This summer marked the first year Emily Augello oversaw adult sailing and started classes for women. Fortunately we had more volunteer instructors this year; that helped cover women's classes. They taught 55 coed adult students and 21 women student sailors. This year's students included couples and friends, some new to sailing and some getting back to sailing after 20+ years away. Everyone got in 6 sessions on the water; they sailed in all conditions—some days they had to reef. Evenings started with chalk talks on the back deck. One Thursday night was too rough to sail, so students practiced on the deck, learning to pass the tiller behind them when coming about. Ray Renaud donated a man-overboard dummy that was used both by youth and adults to practice recoveries. The kids named him Frank and he now lives in the basement. EBSF and all adult sailors are grateful for the generosity of our volunteer instructors, whose long experience adds a dimension to instruction that's invaluable.



The August 2 **Women's Social Sail** was a big success with 44 women signing up and despite light breezes, everyone had a good time. All skill levels were represented, from beginners to women boat owners, and two who had their Masters Licenses. One gal remarked "It was great! I went out with two women I had never met before, we had a good time, and now we know all about each other."

That evening, following a light dinner, the women met and decided to find new ways for NB women to get more access to education, sailing, and opportunities to socialize with other women sailors. They shared details and NORs of upcoming women's regattas— Barrington YC's Old Ladies Trophy (BOLT) on August 11 (attended by two boats from BYC); and another to be held at RIYC on September 6.

Next steps will involve recruiting women from the attending clubs to expand our outreach to women at other NB yacht clubs; developing programming for the upcoming off-season and events for next summer; and building a technical infrastructure that will support communications among these women and their clubs with information about events open to NB women. NBYA has offered to host our new website in their system, so we will build it there. David Schwartz has been an enormous help to get this NBYA support, as has Cathleen Blood, Webmaster of WOWLIS, who shares advice on how to support the new organization's activities.

Time to haul the fleet: By the time you are reading this, our fleet of Mercuries will have been hauled. Once J22 racing finishes on September 3, they will come out, too. We hope you will respond to our call for help when the hauling dates are scheduled and announced.

BYC and EBSF are proud to sponsor an international offshore racing team: With funds from an anonymous restricted grant, EBSF and BYC will co-sponsor a team to represent the US in the prestigious Royal Ocean Racing Club's Offshore Double Handed World Championship. This event is for mixed-gender teams and will be held from September 22 to October 1 in Cowes, Isle of Wight, using Sun Fast 30 One Design Boats. Our team, Jesse Fielding and Leah Sweet, both experienced, well known ocean racers, will be the only team representing the US. We wish them good luck and fair winds.



Finances: As of 31-July we've booked \$200k in program revenue and expect more charter revenue, so we are on track to meet our forecast revenue of \$202K. Pete Levesque's Maintenance Committee and Program Director Emily Augello will be reviewing R&M spending needs over the winter. We plan to set up an audit committee this fall with Bob Elder's guidance in order to perform an audit during the quieter winter months. We have a lot to do in September and October including setting tuition rates and creating a budget for the next fiscal year.

Join us for EBSF's fundraising gala on September 6 at 6 PM at BYC!! We're counting on you and a good turnout to fund next year's programs and scholarships. There'll be a tent on the lawn, plenty of food, and dancing to the Catnip Junkies. There are exciting live auction items: Charlie Enright has donated an afternoon or evening sail or race on the winning bidder's boat; Steve Eddleston who joined BYC this year, owns the 12 m *WEATHERLY* and he is donating an afternoon sail for the winning bidder and guests. Martha Brown has offered a week at her Cayman Island condo; and the Providence River Boating Company is donating a river tour of Providence. Also on offer is 5 nights at a Riomar, Vero Beach, Florida home. There are more
